The long anticipated Pomeroy and Newark Rail Trail will officially open on September 10. A ceremony to open the Trail will be held at 11:00 a.m. on Monday, September 10 at the confluence of the Pomeroy and James F. Hall Trails.

A sister trail to the James F. Hall Trail that opened in 2003, the Pomeroy and Newark Rail Trail will extend north through Newark along the old Pomeroy and Newark Rail Line into the White Clay Creek State Park. It will provide direct access to Main Street, the Newark Shopping Center, and the University of Delaware's Laird Campus. The trail features an 8'-10' wide hard surface, lights for night time use, emergency call boxes, will be ADA accessible, and approximately two (2) miles long.

The City worked closely with consultant, Pennoni Associates, Inc, and construction firm Merit Construction Engineers to create a railroad theme along the trail corridor. Trail users will find static displays and kiosks that show old photos of the operating rail line and information about past freight and passenger rail service to and from Newark.

The City is very excited about the addition of the trail to Newark's trails network and the connectivity it provides the City and beyond.

# City of Newark 2012 Holiday Refuse/Recycling Collection Schedule

The regular refuse/recycling collection schedule must be adjusted during the year for City holidays. The City has two residential collection schedules - one on Monday and Thursday and the other on Tuesday and Friday. Yard waste collections are normally made on Wednesdays.

Wednesdays are also reserved for refuse/recycling collections when there is a holiday during that week. If there is a holiday on Monday, Monday's route is covered on Tuesday and Tuesday's route is rescheduled for Wednesday. Similarly, if the holiday falls on Friday, Thursday's collection is made on Wednesday, and Friday's route is rescheduled for Thursday. The holiday refuse/recycling collection schedule allows for the collection of refuse and recycling once each per week. Green Wednesday Yard Waste collection is canceled during weeks containing a holiday.

WINTER YARD WASTE COLLECTION: Due to the low volume of brush during this time period, the City is taking advantage of the opportunity to save fuel during January and February. During these two months, yard waste will only be collected from those who call the Public Works Department at (302) 366-7040 to schedule their yard waste collection. This will be done on a first call, first-served basis. Regular "Green Wednesday" yard waste collection will resume on March 13.

# Fall Leaf Collection Schedule

The city provides leaf collection as a seasonal service to its residents. Leaf collection begins on Monday, October 15

and continues through Friday, December 14, 2012. All leaves must be raked to the curb by December 7. Residents can reasonably expect four leaf pickups per season.



Monday

Center city from Elkton Road to Marrows Road from Main Street to the northern boundary of Thursday's route and White Chapel.

Tuesday

Northern portion of the city, north of Main Street and east of West Main Street/Nottingham Road (excluding West Branch and Christianstead). To Prepare For Leaf Collection

- Rake and pile leaves in the grassplot area between the curb and sidewalk. DO NOT RAKE LEAVES ON TO THE STREET OR CURBS.
- ☐ To help minimize storm drainage system clogging, please clear or remove any leaves that may have accumulated on the top of the storm drain or catch basins in front of your home.
- Avoid mixing rocks and sticks with leaves. They may damage collection machinery.
- Do not place brush in leaf piles as it may clog machinery.
- ☐ Please park cars in your driveway on collection day to help increase the efficiency of the leaf-loading truck.
- Warn children not to play in leaf piles on streets or near curbs to protect them from injury by unsuspecting motorists.

# Flood Insurance — Do you need it?

You may want to consider obtaining flood insurance if you live in the 100-year floodplain along the main channels of the Christina and White Clay Creeks. Homes built before the adoption of City floodplain regulations may likely be at greater risk of flooding during a severe storm.

Be advised that most homeowners' policies specifically exclude damage caused by floodwaters from rising water, inadequate drainage and wind driven rain. Fortunately, the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) will provide this important insurance to Newark property owners that reside in a floodplain.

This protection has been made available to Newark and other communities that have taken steps to manage and reduce the chances for local residential flooding. Our rigorous floodplain regulations, rated a "Class 7" designation by the Federal Emergency Management Agency, allows Newark residents to take advantage of flood insurance premiums that are 15% lower than the national average. We are proud to acknowledge that our "Class 7" rating is the highest rating of any city in the State of Delaware.

The NFIP coverage is available to any Newark owner or renter of insurable property. To purchase NFIP flood insurance, contact any licensed property insurance agency or broker. If you are not sure if your property is located within the 100-year floodplain of the Christina or White Clay Creeks, please call the Planning and Development Department at (302) 366-7030. Floodplain maps and NFIP brochures are available at both the Planning and Development Department and the Newark Free Library.

# **Protect Yourself From Sewage Back Ups**

Call the City of Newark Public Works Department with any questions at (302) 366-7040, Monday-Friday, 8:30 a.m.—5:00 p.m.

The City of Newark maintains more than 100 miles of sanitary sewer mains located along road rights-of-way and utility easements. In spite of our best efforts blockages of the mains occur which can cause sewage to back up into homes and businesses.

The City is generally not responsible or liable for costs associated with the clean up and repair of the damage caused by such an event.

Residents and business owners can take steps to protect themselves from these situations:

- 1. Standard property insurance typically excludes coverage for damage caused by water backing up into the structure. However, riders can be purchased that will cover some or all of the damages caused by sewage backing up into the home.
- 2. There are also circumstances where it may be prudent to install a back flow device to prevent water from backing up into the home or business. A plumber can help you determine if this would be a good choice.
- 3. Do not put fats, oils, grease, rags, cloth or disposable diapers, sanitary napkins, or paper products, other than toilet paper, down the drain. These items frequently cause problems in the mains and laterals that cause sewage to back up.

In the event that you experience a back up, please call the Water and Wastewater Department at (302) 366-7055 (24 hours a day) and we will send a crew out as quickly as possible to determine where the blockage is located and clear the blockage if it is found to be in the sewer main. If the blockage is in the lateral, it is the responsibility of the property owner to make the necessary arrangements to have the line cleaned.

# Have you seen this in your neighborhood - Do you know why it is important?

Let's take a step back for a quick overview of the City's stormwater program. The City is

covered under a federally required permit and is obligated to perform certain tasks to help keep our stormwater clean and protect local streams. This program, called the NPDES (National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System) Stormwater Program, has been in place since 2003. The program has six elements to it, and requires a cooperative effort between several departments in the City, as well as collaboration with multiple organizations and agencies. The six required elements, called Minimum Control Measures, are:

- Public Education/Outreach Activities such as Newark Day and Community Day educational booths, school programs, and educational utility bill mailings.
- Public Involvement/Participation Activities such as storm drain marking, community cleanups, and Adopt-A-Street.
- Illicit Discharge Detection and Elimination Activities such as outfall inspections, illicit discharge complaint investigation, and participation in household hazardous waste collection events.
- Construction Site Runoff Activities such as inspecting active sites, requiring drainage/maintenance agreements, and reviewing plans.
- Post-Construction Runoff Activities such as inspecting stormwater management areas, and performing maintenance on stormwater management areas.
- Good Housekeeping for Municipal Operations Activities such as street sweeping, catch basin cleaning, and vehicle maintenance.

So, the storm drain marker above is a visible reminder that we all need to do our part to keep pollutants out of storm drains and, therefore, our local streams. # **Fat-Free Sewers:**

# Prevent Fats, Oils and Greases from Damaging Your Home and the Environment.

Grease is a byproduct of cooking that comes from meat fats, lard, oil, shortening, butter, margarine, food scraps, baked goods, sauces and dairy products. When washed down the sink, grease sticks to the insides of sewer pipes (both on your property and in the street). Over time, it can build up and block an entire pipe.

Caution: Home garbage disposals do not keep grease out of the plumbing system. Moreover, hot water and products such as detergents that claim to dissolve grease only pass it down the line and cause problems elsewhere.

### You Can Help!

- Never pour grease down sink drains or into toilets.
- Scraping grease and food scraps into a can or the trash for disposal (or recycling where available).
- Putting baskets/strainers in sink drains to catch food scraps and other solids, and emptying them into the trash.
- Speaking with your friends and neighbors about how to keep grease out of sewers.

# Make Your Own Rain Barrel

Are you interested in making your own rain barrel? Visit the website below, and scroll to the bottom of the page to find a Rain Barrel brochure detailing how to make your own, and the parts you will need. Keep in mind, there are many ways to make one and you don't have to use a barrel – you can use a large terra cotta pot or an old trash can with a tight-fitting lid. Be creative and conserve water at the same time.
