# City Manager's Message

#### **Efficiency Matters – Now More than Ever**

Many of you may be aware that our Mayor and Council recently approved the implementation of a Smart Meter Project for Newark. You should also know that we have been evaluating the feasibility of this project for more than a year, and that a great deal of effort took place to determine whether now was the right time for its implementation.

To begin, the overall goal of city staff as we approached this project was that it had to be in the best interest of our community and it had to provide opportunities for greater efficiencies. As your City Manager, efficiency is of the utmost importance to me. Our organization will be focusing on this at every opportunity in the near future so that we can continue to provide the services you have come to expect, as the cost of offering them continues to increase. What is efficiency anyway? An online dictionary states it is the ability to accomplish a job with minimum expenditure of time and effort. Time, of course, translates to cost. While many would suggest that means we have to do more with less and quicker, I believe we have to do more with more...

- we have to embrace more technology and communication options;
- engage in more teamwork and partnership opportunities;
- commit to more cross training within our workforce;
- provide more in-field capabilities and;
- make more use of the data that we collect for organizational decision making.

Using the smart meter project as one example, I can share how we will be doing more with more. Once the 20,000+ water and electric meters are installed we will have further embraced technology and communication to the benefit of both our customers and our operations. You will have a greater level of and more accurate information available to better understand your utility usage, and we will receive the information without having to visit each of the 20,000+ meters. Best of all, no more guarterly surprises for your water and sewer billings!

The smart meter project represents teamwork and partnerships between Newark, DNREC, Honeywell, our banking partners, suppliers and installers. The project is funded through the use of tax-exempt leases that will be paid off over a 10 to 15 year term. Mayor and Council agreed to dedicate the increased revenue from the new water meters, which are naturally more accurate, and the operational savings made possible by the project's implementation to fund the repayment instead of channeling these funds to other areas of our operations. Additionally, since the city entered into a Guaranteed Performance Contract with Honeywell, we are guaranteed to achieve at least 98% of the meter accuracy identified. Simply put, if we don't reach that goal, they cut us a check.

Likewise, the smart meter project provides for in-field work applications so that staff can continue to provide services or solve problems without returning to City Hall. This efficiency also opens the door to opportunities to cross train staff to maintain service levels at similar or reduced costs.

The smart meter project will provide detailed utility data and opportunities to conserve through simply understanding usage better. In the future, it may also provide greater opportunities for conservation/cost avoidance to those that choose it as associated with optional time of use metering or demand response programs that have yet to be considered or evaluated by Newark. The smart meter infrastructure will also serve as the backdrop for additional cameras on city streets and allow for continual leak detection and improved electrical outage management and voltage control. Translation: we identify and address leaks and outages sooner.

And since efficiency matters, now more than ever, we will continue to explore additional efficiency measures to determine that we are providing your services at the level you expect in the appropriate amount of time, with the right amount of effort at a reasonable cost. Rest assured our employees are up to the challenge! Other efficiency measures we have been working on include:

- Gaining greater abilities for accurately deploying our workforce as a result of the installation of a networked fleet tracking system.
- A new organization wide phone system will replace our outdated and failing system and will allow for better understanding of our customer service needs and real information to assist with decisions regarding staffing levels and/or assignments.
- Information technology improvements that allow our staff to do their work better and more efficiently in various departments including increased shared information capabilities that will lead to improved customer service.

# **SOLICITATION OF CANDIDATES NOTICE**

The City of Newark will hold its annual municipal election on Tuesday, April 9, 2013. The offices for which an election will be held are the office of Mayor and Council Member for Districts 1, 2 and 4. Council Members serve two-year terms; the Mayor serves a three-year term.

Any qualified voter of the city who, for a period of at least 15 years next preceding the election has not been convicted of a felony, as that crime is designated by the State of Delaware, and who has resided in the city for at least one year next preceding the election, shall be eligible to hold the office of Council Member and/or Mayor. A qualified voter, eligible to hold the office of Council Member, shall mean a person who is a registered voter at the time his/her nominating petition is filed and who resides in the district he/she seeks to represent. A qualified voter, eligible to hold the office of Mayor, shall mean a person who is a registered voter at the time his/her nominating petition is filed and who resides in the City of Newark.

All nominations for City Council shall be declared by petition which can be obtained in the City Secretary's Office, 220 South Main Street, Newark, DE, Monday through Friday, between the hours of 8:30 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. Each nominating petition shall be signed by the candidate and, in addition, shall bear the signatures of 10 qualified voters residing in the district from which the candidate seeks election; the office of Mayor's petition requires 10 qualified signatures as welll, but may be comprised of any and all district(s). Petitions with all requisite signatures must be filed with the City Secretary by **5:00 p.m., EDT, on Monday, March 11, 2013** in order to be eligible for candidacy in the April 9, 2013 election.

#### **OUR PART**

City crews have over ten miles of city-maintained sidewalk to clear during and after a snow event to clear the sidewalks as soon as possible. The Street Division of the cakity's Public Works & Water Resources Department performs snow removal on residential streets. The State Highway Department is responsible for plowing major routes such as portions of Routes 273, 896, and 4.

To assist crews in effectively removing snow from streets, residents should park their cars in their driveway. If a snow emergency is declared by the City Manager, please observe parking bans on designated snow emergency routes. (Snow emergencies are broadcast on WJBR, WDEL, WILM, WSTW, Channel 22 and on the website.)

#### Your Part

Residents are responsible for clearing sidewalks of snow or ice within 24 hours after snow fall. Pathways must be at least 3' wide in residential areas and 4' wide in commercial districts. Code Enforcement Officers can issue a violation to persons failing to comply with the snow removal ordinance. Additionally, the city may clear sidewalks and charge the resident for the removal cost. A minimum \$100 fee will be charged for city snow removal.

When shoveling, pile snow on the front lawn rather than the grassplot area between the curb and sidewalk. This allows extra storage space for snow pushed to the side by snowplows. Please keep catch basins and gutters clear of snow. To help locate hydrants in the event of a fire emergency, please keep fire hydrants visible and clear of snow. When shoveling your driveway, pile snow on the side of the driveway in the direction that will be cleared by snowplows. This will minimize the possibility that snowplows will redeposit snow back on your driveway.

We recycle your leaves each fall and spring and provide the mulch created from them to you for use in your yards and gardens. The mulch pile is located at the City water tower on Rte. 896.

- Rake and pile leaves in the grassplot area between the curb and sidewalk. Do not rake leaves onto the street or
- To help minimize storm drainage system clogging, please clear or remove any leaves that have accumulated on the top of the storm drain or catch basins near your home.
- Avoid mixing rocks and sticks with leaves. They may damage our collection equipment.
- Do not place brush in leaf piles, as it may clog machinery.
- Please park cars in your driveway on collection day to help increase the efficiency of the program.
- Warn children not to play in leaf piles on streets or near curbs to protect them from vehicular injury by unsuspecting motorists.

#### **REDD PARK TRAILS UPDATE**

We have nearly completed phases III and IV of the trail relocation and building project at Redd Park. Our objective is to finish these phases and begin the fifth and final phase in 2013. When completed, the trail network will include more than two miles of new and reconditioned all-weather trails. The trails are suitable for hiking, walking, jogging or mountain biking.

Redd Park is a beautiful 68-acre forested City park located just north of the Newark Reservoir and is bordered to the east by the community of The Hunt at Louviers and to the west by The Woods at Louviers. For access to the trails, parking is available at the south end of the Reservoir and at the south end of Odessa Way in The Woods at Louviers. There are also access points from within each of these neighborhoods.

We continue to work with the Delaware Trail Spinners and the Delaware State Parks Trails Crew to construct the trails. More than 4,000 volunteer labor hours have been committed to the project thus far. We were able to secure a second grant to fund phase V through the Delaware Land and Water Conservation Trust Fund. This grant program funds planning and constructing outdoor recreation facilities.

# Winter "Green Wednesday" Yard Waste Collection Schedule

# **POMEROY AND NEWARK RAIL TRAIL**

IT'S OPEN AND IN USE! On September 10, Governor Markell, Senator Carper, Mayor Funk, several other special guests and more than 70 others attended the official opening of the Pomeroy and Newark Rail Trail (PNRT). The two (2) mile long trail connects with the James F. Hall Trail to the south and the White Clay Creek State Park to the north. The former rail line is back in the business of transporting people although now by way of walking, jogging and bicycling. With the completion of the PNRT there are now more than 18 miles of trails in Newark's park system. The trail was constructed for 24-hour use and provides great connectivity to Downtown Newark, the Newark Shopping Center, the University of Delaware's Laird Campus and the White Clay Creek State Park. Partnerships are key with projects like this. The PNRT was the Grand Daddy of partnerships. The City of Newark partnered with the Federal Highway Administration, DelDOT, Delaware State Parks, University of Delaware, the University Courtyard Apartments, DART, the

Newark Shopping Center, Pennoni Associates, Merit Construction Engineers and the Wilmington and Western Railroad.

#### **SKATE SPOTS**

There are lots of skateboarders in Newark but nowhere to legally and safely do so. We want to change that!

The Parks Department will make a recommendation to the City Manager, in January or February, to award a design/build contract for the Skate Spot project. We advertised the contract and received proposals from three highly qualified firms. Newark will construct two Skate Spots, one at Phillips Park and one at Handloff Park. Once we have selected a firm the planning and design process will begin.

We would really like to get input from local skate boarders to help with the design. Our plan is to hold at least one workshop to solicit design ideas. Funding for the project has been secured from three sources – Newark's Capital Budget, a grant from the Delaware Land and Water Conservation Trust Fund for Outdoor Recreation, and a private donation.



When we are ready to begin construction we will need lumber, nails, rebar, concrete and other building materials. If you, or someone you know, would like to donate materials or contribute monetarily to the project, please call the Parks and Recreation Office at (302) 366-7060.

#### **ENHANCING NEWARK'S URBAN TREE CANOPY**

In 2008, the Delaware State Forest Service applied for, and was awarded, a grant through the U.S. Forest Service to study and map the urban tree canopy for each of Delaware's 57 municipalities. Mapping was completed in January of 2012. The grant also funded four pilot projects to plant trees to increase the percentage of tree cover in these selected communities; Newark, Delaware City, Rehoboth Beach, and South Bethany.

In late 2010, Kyle Hoyd, Urban Forest Coordinator with Delaware State Forest Service, met with Charlie Emerson, Newark Parks and Recreation Director and Tom Zaleski, Newark Parks Superintendent, to review the grant program and discuss the effort to increase Newark's tree canopy. The study revealed that Newark's urban tree canopy was 25.5%. According to both the U.S. Forest Service and the State Forest Service, a healthy percentage of tree cover

within any urban area should be 30% or greater. Newark agreed to take part and set a goal of obtaining 30% tree cover by 2021. This goal would be reached by completing a multi-phased tree planting program in which a variety of native deciduous and evergreen trees will be planted on City parkland, open space areas, stream buffer areas, and in new subdivisions.

The first phase of the project was completed in 2011. One hundred eighty six trees were planted in several parks, open space areas, and subdivisions. The plantings on public lands were funded through two sources - the grant from the State Forest Service and a donation from the Rotary Club of Newark. The Rotary Club also helped to plant the trees.



The second phase was completed in November 2012 with 24 new trees planted. The purchase and installation of these trees was funded by the State Forest Service. Including the first two phases of the Parks and Recreation Department's efforts and plantings at new subdivisions, more than 370 new trees were planted in 2011 and 2012 increasing Newark's urban tree canopy to 27.5%.
