



City of Newark Council Elections

The 2018 election for City Council Districts 3 and 5 is being held on Tuesday, April 10. Polls are open from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m. The polling place for District 3 is Aetna Fire Station #7, located at 7 Thorn Lane. The polling place for District 5 is First Presbyterian Church located at 292 West Main Street. The candidates for District 3 are Richard Nietubicz and Jennifer Wallace. The candidates for District 5 are Neel Barua, Jason M. Lawhorn and Lena F. Thayer. As only one candidate filed for District 6, A. Stuart Markham, Jr., Mr. Markham will be declared the winner in that district and sworn in at the April 19 Council organizational meeting.

To vote in the April 10 Council election, you must be at least 18 years of age by Election Day, a U.S. citizen and have established residency in the City for at least 24 days prior to the election. The voter registration deadline is Monday, March 19. If you are unsure if you are registered, please call the City Secretary's office at (302) 366-7000.

Absentee ballots are also available for those who cannot get to the polls on April 10. An absentee ballot can be requested and sent to your home by downloading the form at newarkde.gov/election and returning it to the City Secretary's Office. You also may stop by the office between 8:30 a.m. and 5 p.m., Monday through Friday, to vote in person and have your absentee affidavit notarized, if required. All absentee ballots must be returned to the City Secretary's Office no later than 5 p.m. the day of the election.

Automatic Bill Payment/Leak Notification System—Customer Connect

The City of Newark would like to remind all residents that monthly utility bills can be processed automatically via CustomerConnect. Did you know CustomerConnect also has features that will alert you when your household exceeds certain consumption thresholds? This tool is helpful for finding water leaks, or unintended electric usage before it goes on for a prolonged period of time, saving you money. The notification thresholds can be set by the account holder on a monthly, weekly or daily basis. It's another way of keeping utility consumption to a minimum. The account holder can elect to be notified by email, text and via notice to their web portal account.

Newark utility customers also have the option to pay the City for utility services using CustomerConnect's "Budget Billing" option. This method of payment allows the account holder to pay a fixed amount each month on the date of their choosing when they sign up for this feature. The system determines your estimated annual utility bill and divides that amount by twelve months. On the December bill, there will be a true up for whatever balance that remains (either a credit or debit to the account) to settle the balance for the year.

Please go to https://newarkde.gov/pay to set up your account. In order to keep costs to a minimum, the City urges CutomerConnect users to set up their accounts to their bank debit account vs a credit card.

IMPORTANT: Stormwater charges went into effect on January 1, 2018. For additional

InformMe Notification—Newark's Citizen Notification System allows you to choose the information you want to receive from the City of Newark and the method through which you receive it. You will continue to receive the mandatory emergency alerts but you can also choose to receive any of our other alert options such as refuse/recycling changes, electric utility alerts/crime alerts and more. These alerts are available by home phone, e-mail, cell phone and text messages.
