



City of Newark Leaf Program Refuse Collection Schedule Changes

The Leaf Collection Program will continue through Friday, December 28, 2018. <u>All leaves must be raked to the grassy plot between the curb and the sidewalk by Friday, December 21.</u>

<u>Please Note</u>: The last "Green Wednesday" yard waste collection for the Winter Season will be on December 5 and will not resume until March 6, 2019. Please call Public Works and Water Resources at (302)366-7000 to schedule a collection if needed. Carts put out for collection that have not been scheduled will not be collected.

Due to the Thanksgiving Day holiday, recycling normally collected on Thursday, November 22, will be collected on Wednesday, November 21. There will be no changes to Friday's recycling collection. There will be no "Green Wednesday" Yard Waste Collection on Wednesday, November 21.

Due to the Christmas Day holiday, trash normally collected on Tuesday, December 25, will be collected on Wednesday, December 26. There will be no change to Monday's trash collection.

Due to the New Year's Day holiday, trash normally collected on Tuesday, January 1, will be collected on Wednesday, January 2, 2019. There will be no change to Monday's trash collection.
