<u>University of Delaware Student Population</u>

- The Chair opened the meeting by clarifying how University of Delaware classifies student population and provided data:
 - University of Delaware's total student population number reflects all students, even if they are not attending classes on the Newark campus
 - Student population can be broken down by campus location to accurately reflect student numbers in Newark, see attached documents
 - Expected total undergraduate student population by 2021 = 19,500 (includes all campuses)
 - Online graduate program enrollees are counted in student population totals
- English Language Institute (ELI)
 - A separate program offered by the University
 - o ELI students are not counted as part of the total student population
 - UD houses about 100 ELI students on campus, other students are housed in a community overseen by ELI at The Retreat, and through a Homestay program
 - About 200 students get matriculated into the UD population upon completion of the ELI program each year and become part of the undergraduate student population

University of Delaware Housing

- UD capacity each year can house approximately 7400 students
- Graduate students; important distinction from undergraduates
 - Popular housing trends for graduate students:

- Graduates are often looking for a separation between undergraduates and graduates, GAs don't necessarily want to live with the students they are teaching and want a more mature community.
- Living in major cities, commuting to class
- Those enrolled in online graduate programs don't necessarily need housing
- Could be working adults with families not looking for rentals
- There is a need in Newark for a young professional housing market
 - Recommendation: Star Campus area may be an opportunity as job opportunities become available

Defining Living Arrangements of University of Delaware Students

- University of Delaware plans to implement a survey (fall 2019)
 - Utilizing surveys that are already in existence to prevent survey exhaustion
 - Gathering information like do you live a home with a parent/guardian, renting in the city, purchased home, etc.?
 - o Similar information needs to be collected for the graduate program

Constraints and Issues

- On campus housing
 - o Upper division students prefer apartment style housing
 - There is no current, tentative or finalized plan in place for UD to develop additional housing
- Students in single family rental properties struggle finding someone to fill/take over their lease
- Normalizing the Housing/Leasing Market
 - University of Delaware is implementing an Off Campus Housing Fair and hoping to include more rental properties and educate students on available properties - could alleviate the "frenzy" around leasing
 - Could include education on important leasing dates, contact information, map of rental properties
 - To consider: Some rental properties/developers/landlords might not want to be listed together on one list

Community Relations Campaign


- Goal is to create a small town feel and educate students on how to live in rental properties/neighborhoods
