



CURBSIDE RECYCLING PROGRAM

The City of Newark offers curbside recycling once a week to our residents. There is no need to separate recyclables; all items go into the same cart. Please remember all recycling should be placed loose in your cart—**DO NOT BAG RECYCLING**. The following are **ACCEPTABLE** items for recycling:

- Paper/Newspapers/Brown Paper Bags/Magazines
- Telephone/Soft Cover Books/Junk Mail (all types)
- Cardboard/Paperboard (cereal/tissue boxes)
- Narrow-Neck Plastic Bottles
- Milk Jugs, Bleach/Detergent, Shampoo Bottles
- Glass Bottles/Jars (any color)
- Metal Cans (tin/steel/aluminum)

The following items **ARE NOT ACCEPTABLE** for recycling:

- GROCERY BAGS—Please return all plastic grocery bags to the store you got them from for recycling.
- Motor oil and oil filters, household batteries, styrofoam accepted at Newark Recycle Center – 470 Corporate Blvd., (Monday-Saturday 8:30 a.m.-3:30 p.m.)
- Shredded paper, waxed paper, plastic film
- Household hazardous materials such as paint, fluorescent light bulbs, aerosol cans, bleach, home cleaning chemicals, explosives, nail polish remover, and medicines. FALL LEAF COLLECTION

Fall leaf collection begins Monday, October 9 through December 29, 2023. Residents should rake leaves to the grassy area between the sidewalk and the curb. Collection will occur once per week from mid-October to mid-November and then every two weeks until the end of December. To prepare for leaf collection, please remember:

- Rake and pile leaves (no bagging) in the grassplot between the sidewalk and curb. **Do not rake leaves into the street.**
- Avoid raking leaves to the curb within three days of a significant weather event.
- To avoid small piles being missed, please use your yard waste cart.
- Please keep all storm drains and catch basins clear near your home.
- Avoid mixing rock and sticks with your leaves as they may damage collection machinery.
- Please avoid piling leaves around mailboxes or sign posts.

Lead Service Line FAQs

In case you had concerns, here are some frequently asked questions and answers to clear things up.

WILL THIS SURVEY LEAD TO HIGHER WATER PRICES?

No! In fact, completing the survey is the best way to keep water rates stable. If we don't gather enough information on water service types, we may have to perform costly excavations that could lead to an increase in water rates.

WHAT IF YOU DON'T RECEIVE ENOUGH RESPONSES?

Without adequate voluntarily information, we will have to perform the work ourselves, which is very expensive and invasive. The more surveys we receive, the higher the chances we will qualify for grant funding to replace any lead service lines that are identified.

WHO PAYS IF LEAD PIPES ARE FOUND IN MY HOME?

Newark will pay to replace lead service lines outside of the home. We will work with homeowners to identify options for securing low interest loans or grant funding to replace any lead lines found in the home.

WILL THE CITY CITE ME IF OTHER VIOLATIONS ARE FOUND IN MY PHOTO?

No, submitted photos will only be used for verification of pipe material. However, we will inform residents if unsafe conditions are observed.

WHAT DO I NEED TO COMPLETE THE SURVEY?

You will need a flathead screwdriver, magnet and a penny to determine the pipe material. Then, you will need a smartphone to capture a photo and upload your survey results.
