NEWARK POLICE DEPARTMENT ANNUAL AWARDS

Chief Mark Farrall honored Newark Police officers and staff, an officer from the University of Delaware Police Department, and civilians for their efforts in 2023 during a ceremony on April 3, 2024.

Pastors Kevin Benjamin and Lonnie Rector, the newest police chaplains for the Newark Police Department, were also formally presented by Chief Farrall.

One of the Newark Police Department's top honors, the Nowinski Award, was given out for two officers who helped a victim in a deadly crash and held her hand while she was critically hurt. A Citation for Bravery was also given to two policemen for their actions in racing toward gunfire that happened not far from where they were conducting foot patrol.

Additionally, rewards for notable arrests and "going above and beyond" were given to the officers.

HOME BUYER INCENTIVE PROGRAM

The City's Home Buyer Incentive Program provides interest free deferred loans up to \$5,000 to assist income qualified first-time homebuyers to purchase properties within the City of Newark. The funds can be used for up to 50% of down payment and 100% of settlement closing costs associated with the purchase of the home. All funding requested will be used for the Home Buyer Incentive Program loans and program costs (mortgage recording fees, lead paint, and electrical inspections, etc.) The loans will be secured by a second mortgage on the home to be purchased. The funding will provide loans for a qualifying low-to-moderate income home buyer from July 1st – June 30th every year.
