SAVE MONEY ON ELECTRIC COSTS THIS SUMMER!

CITY OF NEWARK TO BEGIN CHARGING CREDIT AND DEBIT CARD SERVICE FEES

In an ongoing effort to provide the exceptional service Newark customers are accustomed to receiving, the City announces that effective Monday, July 15, 2024, payments for certain transactions using credit and debit cards will include a service fee. This fee, which will be collected directly by the payment processor, will help manage expenses incurred from credit and debit card transactions and better manage operational costs.

Payments for taxes, permits, licenses, and general billing will be impacted by this change. The service fee will be equal to 3.95% of the billed amount, or \$2.50, whichever is greater. Payments made by phone will incur an additional \$.50 fee. For customers that wish to avoid this fee, payments via check and cash are encouraged, which will remain free of additional charges. Customers will also have the option to pay by eCheck at no additional charge, except for \$.50 if the payment is made by phone.

"We understand that any additional cost may be a concern and we assure our customers that we carefully considered this decision. We're pleased to continue offering lower cost and free payment options including cash, check, and eCheck," said Finance Director David Del Grande. "The City of Newark remains committed to providing services that meet the highest standards of quality and value."

SENIOR HOME REPAIR PROGRAM

The Newark Senior Center works with the Community Services Corporation to assist eligible homeowners, who are aged 60+, living in the City of Newark, by providing FREE home repairs through the Senior Home Repair Program. The program addresses minor home repair needs that focus on health, safety, and security conditions of the home. Qualifying repairs under the program include:

- Installing, repairing, or replacing doors, windows, screens, gutters, shingles, or other roofing
- Outlets & light switches
- Hand & stair railings & grab bars
- Minor plumbing repairs
- Building ramps & widening doorways
- Weather stripping, caulking, air seals & insulation


