CURBSIDE RECYCLING PROGRAM

The City of Newark offers curbside recycling once a week to our residents. There is no need to separate recyclables; all items go into the same cart.

Please remember all recycling should be placed loose in your cart—DO NOT BAG RECYCLING. The following are **ACCEPTABLE** items for recycling:

- · Paper/Newspapers/Brown Paper Bags/Magazines
- · Telephone/Soft Cover Books/Junk Mail (all types)
- · Cardboard/Paperboard (cereal/tissue boxes)
- $\cdot \ \text{Narrow-Neck Plastic Bottles}$
- · Milk Jugs, Bleach/Detergent, Shampoo Bottles
- · Glass Bottles/Jars (any color)
- $\cdot \ \text{Metal Cans (tin/steel/aluminum)} \\$

The following items **ARE NOT ACCEPTABLE** for recycling: • GROCERY BAGS—Please return all plastic grocery bags to the store you got them from for recycling.



FALL LEAF COLLECTION

Fall leaf collection begins Monday, October 14 through Friday, December 27, 2024. Residents should rake leaves to the grassy area between the sidewalk and the curb. Collection will occur once per week from mid-October to mid-November and then every two weeks until the end of December. To prepare for leaf collection, please remember:

- · Rake and pile leaves (no bagging) in the grassplot between the sidewalk and curb. **Do not rake leaves into the street.**
- \cdot Avoid raking leaves to the curb within three days of a significant weather event.
- \cdot To avoid small piles being missed, please use your yard waste cart.
- \cdot Please keep all storm drains and catch basins clear near your home.
- \cdot Avoid mixing rock and sticks with your leaves as they may damage collection machinery.
- · Please avoid piling leaves around mailboxes or signposts.

REVENUE SHARING FUNDS: MEALS ON WHEELS

Meals on Wheels provides nutritional meals that meet dietary needs for the homebound in our community. The program ensures that homebound, elderly, and/or disabled residents receive at least one nutritious meal a day. It is run strictly by volunteers and in-kind donations, providing approximately 100 meals a day to residents in the Newark area. The Meals on Wheels program is the only one proven to prevent residents from being prematurely admitted to a long-term care facility. It offers both long-term and short-term meal services. There is no waitlist to participate, and clients are not turned away due to an inability to pay. In 2024, the City of Newark provided \$20,000 to the Meals on Wheels program through the revenue sharing grant program. These funds are used to help the program continue to provide meals to our most vulnerable populations.
