SILVERBLAZE - UTILITY BILLING UPGRADE

We are thrilled to present SilverBlaze, our brand-new utility billing consumer interface!

The launch of SilverBlaze took place on October 17. Great new features of the updated portal include the ability to compare water and electricity usage on a daily, monthly, or even annual basis, as well as the ability to set alarms for the detection of water leaks.

The City of Newark sent active account holders an email on the go-live date with existing login information and a link to the new portal. Account information is accessible when the password change is completed. Due to the upgrade, you will need to re-enroll in AutoPay and/or Budget Billing on the new site if you were previously enrolled in those programs.

AFFORDABLE HOUSING WORKSHOPS

The City of Newark's Planning and Development
Department invite City residents and stakeholders to
engage in conversations surrounding the planning efforts
for increasing affordable housing opportunities in
Newark, with a focus on reforms to the City's Zoning
Code. There are two "Drop In" Public Workshops
scheduled for the public to attend:

Among the zoning reforms being considered is Inclusionary Zoning (IZ), a strategy that aims to provide affordable housing opportunities by utilizing private housing developers who are requesting permission to build new market-rate housing to allocate a predetermined percentage of units at below-market rates that are affordable for low-income homeowners or renters. To ensure that the rent or purchase price is

The Newark Bike Project (NBP) is a volunteer-based nonprofit community bike shop that provides bicycles to individuals in the greater Newark area who need transportation and wish to maintain a healthy, active lifestyle through its Free Bike Program. The program aims to empower the local community by supplying bicycles or the parts needed to repair them at no cost to those who require financial assistance, as supported and referred to by social service organizations. Program participants are typically low-income, with their specific needs identified by partners such as Friendship House, Delaware Health and Human Services. Jewish Family Services, and local schools. NBP also offers a free repair assistance program for those who already have a bicycle but need repairs. In addition to bicycles, participants receive locks, helmets, lights, and free repairs. Half of the program's recipients live in Newark zip codes. In 2024, with funding provided by the City of Newark's revenue-sharing program, NBP served 12 residents, providing 12 gifted bicycles, 11 helmets, 10 bicycle locks, and 10 bike lights.

HVAC CONVERSION FROM GAS/OIL TO ELECTRIC INCENTIVE PROGRAM

Attention Newark Homeowners: The City of Newark is providing up to five (5) grants up to \$4,000 towards the conversion of an oil or gas-powered HVAC systems to an electric HVAC system. Homeowners that make below 120% of the area median income can receive up to \$4,000, paid directly to the contractor, for converting their oil or gas HVAC to electric power.

Converting your HVAC from oil to electric is an environmentally-friendly and cost-effective option for heating and cooling your home. Among the many benefits, electric HVACs can:

- Significantly reduce your carbon footprint by producing fewer greenhouse gas emissions.
- Lower your energy bills due to increased efficiency.
- Provide better indoor air quality by eliminating combustion emissions.

To be eligible, you must be a City of Newark homeowner and have a total household income below 120% of the area median income for New Castle County.

within the reach of a household earning less than 80% of the local median income, an inclusionary zoning requirement can, for instance, mandate that any new development deed limit 10% of the total units. The workshop's goal is to educate the public, solicit their opinions, and encourage further participation in resolving Newark's affordable housing issues.
