

The Diversity and Inclusion Ordinance

Newark City Code, Chapter 2, Article XV, Section 2-168 to 2-172, (Ordinance 21-12 Amendment I 4/26/21).

Sec. 2-168. – Creation of the diversity and inclusion commission; purpose of:

- a) The council of the City of Newark hereby establishes the Diversity an Inclusion Commission.
- b) Purpose: The purpose of the Diversity of Inclusion Commission is to provide advice and recommendations to the city staff in regard to the following:
 - 1) Recommend strategies to achieve Newark's vision to be an inclusive community that embraces diversity, enabling and supporting different lifestyles by encouraging cooperation, tolerance and respect among and by all persons who come into contact with the City of Newark, including residents, students, visitors, employers and employees.
 - 2) Assist the city and the community to eliminate and prevent all forms of discrimination, hate or bias.
 - 3) Act as conduit for complaints in the area of diversity, equity and inclusion. Any related complaints about city staff will be transmitted to the city manager for investigation and follow-up in accordance with city policy.
 - 4) Recommend methods to improve diversity recruitment and retention efforts at all levels of city government including council, boards/commissions, and staff.
 - 5) Provide education regarding the community's overall diversity.
 - 6) Recommend effective strategies for improved public engagement and methods to remove or reduce barriers to improve access to city services for our diverse population.
 - 7) Recommend areas for investment where needs are greatest, addressing root causes of inequities and lack of access to more smartly allocate our public resources.
 - 8) Recommend opportunities for community partnerships as a strategy to better understand and address equity impacts throughout our city.
 - 9) Facilitate the building of relationships with under-served and underrepresented communities and serve as trusted messengers to the community at large.
 - 10) Prepare an annual report to council on the previous year's activities of the commission and the forthcoming year's goals.
 - 11) Perform such other duties as the mayor and/or city council may direct. (Ord. No. 21-12, Amend. No. 1, 04-26-2021)

Mission Statement

The commission is charged with recommending strategies to achieve Newark's vision to be an inclusive community that embraces diversity, enabling and supporting different lifestyles encouraging cooperation, tolerance, and respect for all persons who come in contact with the City of Newark, including residents, students, visitors, employers and employees.

Commission Members

The Diversity and Inclusion Commission have seven members with the mayor and each council member nominating one member each to be appointed with the approval of the mayor and council. All members shall be at-large appointments. Members are not required to reside within the city, but at minimum shall have a connection to Newark as an employee of a Newark business or as a student or have unique knowledge, skills, or abilities to advance the purpose of the committee. Four members shall constitute a quorum.

Terms: The mayor and council members in Districts 3, 5 and 6 shall have appointee terms that expire in even numbered years and he members appointed by council members in Districts 1, 2, and 4 shall have terms that expire in odd numbered years. Thereafter, all terms shall be for two years. Upon the expiration of a term of appointment, a member shall serve until his or her successor has been duly appointed.

Members of the Diversity and Inclusion Commission shall serve without compensation. However, members shall e reimbursed for reasonable expenses subject to travel and reimbursement procedures of the city.

The Diversity and Inclusion Commission shall meet at least once each quarter-year at times and places of its choosing in compliance with Delaware's Freedom of Information Act and Section 2-5.1 of the City Code.
