TOM COLEMAN CREDENTIALED BY INTERNATIONAL LOCAL GOVERNMENT MANAGEMENT ORGANIZATION

Tom Coleman, City Manager for the City of Newark, Delaware, recently received the Credentialed Manager designation from ICMA, the International City/County Management Association. Mr. Coleman is one of over 1,300 local government management professionals currently credentialed through the ICMA Voluntary Credentialing Program.

ICMA's mission is to advance professional local government through leadership, management, innovation, and ethics and by increasing the proficiency of appointed chief administrative officers, assistant administrators, and other employees who serve local governments and regional entities around the world. The organization's 13,000 members in 27 countries also include educators, students, and other local government employees.

To receive the prestigious ICMA credential, a member must have significant experience as a senior management executive in local government; have earned a degree, preferably in public administration or a related field; and demonstrated a commitment to high standards of integrity and to lifelong learning and professional development.





CITY OF NEWARK ELECTION RESULTS 2025

Councilman Travis McDermott won a decisive victory on April 8 to become Newark's next mayor. McDermott defeated University of Delaware professor Mike O'Neal. He was sworn in on April 17 and will serve a three-year term. Mayor McDermott is replacing Jerry Clifton.

In the District 1 city council race, incumbent John Suchanec easily defeated three challengers to earn another two-year term. Suchanec defeated Demitri Theodoropoulos, Rebecca Stewart, and Walton Babich.

CITY OF NEWARK POINT OF INTEREST: Iron Hill Museum & Science Center

The Iron Hill Museum & Science Center is a "hidden gem" of Newark, both historically and educationally. It is the oldest natural history museum in Delaware. Located off Old Baltimore Pike on Robert L. Melson Lane, the Center is run by the Delaware Academy of Science and is the primary resource for studying the history of the Iron Hill

A University of Delaware graduate, he remained involved with the school's engineering program through teaching and mentorship for several years.



Cooch's Bridge, the site of the only combat ever fought on Delaware land, is half a mile from Iron Hill. Iron Hill served as a vantage point for Lafayette, General George Washington, and General Nathaniel Green in 1777 to keep an eye out for British troops coming from the Elk River. In 1814, Caesar Rodney, a hero of the Revolutionary War, set up camp on Iron Hill.

The Iron Hill Museum building was originally the Iron Hill School #112C, an African American School built in 1923 and operated until 1964. The school became a museum in 1968 and was placed on the National Register of Historic Places in 1995.

Historical artifacts from the area can be found in the Science Center adjacent to the school. Rocks and minerals, fossils, wildlife displays, and artifacts from the Lenape Indians—the area's original inhabitants—are all on display. The Iron Hill Trail, which goes to an iron mine, is connected to the Science Center. Informational exhibits on the region from the 1800s to the present day can be found along the path.

The Museum is open Tuesday through Saturday with a \$2.00 general admission. There are a multitude of programs available including summer science camps, merit badge programs, an archaeology festival, the Iron Hill Powwow, an earth science program, and a Native American program. NEWARK PARKING AMBASSADORS TO BEGIN WEARING BODY WORN CAMERAS

The City of Newark announces that Parking Division field employees including Parking Ambassadors and Parking Coordinators will begin wearing body worn cameras as part of their issued uniforms. These devices will function as a de-escalation tool and gather critical evidence used in court cases by capturing video and audio of interactions between staff and customers. Additionally, it allows for better insight on why certain decisions are made, which leads to improved customer service, and can be used as a training tool for new Parking Division employees.



SEAN'S HOUSE - UNLOCKE THE LIGHT

Sean's House is a nonprofit organization that provides resources for youth struggling with depression, self-injury, and suicidal thoughts. They have three main objectives: to educate, support, and assist young people who may be dealing with mental illness. The City of Newark provides Revenue Sharing funds for their SL24 Mental Health Access Scholarship Program, which was created to help young individuals experiencing acute mental health episodes who require specialized professional services beyond what Sean's House can provide. This scholarship covers services for those who are uninsured, underinsured, or face financial barriers to accessing mental health care.
