WEEKLY REPORT 1/3-1/9/10

On Friday, January 8th, a Newark resident reported that he had attempted to purchase a Yorkshire Terrier from a person in Oklahoma. The victim wired a total of \$1,400.00 over four separate occasions but never received the dog and has been unable to locate the seller.

On Sunday, January 10th, at 11:29 p.m., officers responded to a report of an armed robbery at the Friendly's Restaurant located on South College Avenue. Employees stated that a man armed with a handgun entered the restaurant through the rear door and entered the office. The suspect then took all of the money and ordered the employees into a freezer. After the suspect fled, an employee called police.

On Tuesday, January 12th, officers responded to Dunkin Donuts on Main Street on a report of a man sitting on the floor asking employees for a knife so he could kill himself. The subject was transported to CER.

Crime in Newark decreased in 2009. Robberies decreased by 10.6% from 2008. This represents a 40.4% decrease in robberies since 2006. Aggravated Assault decreased by 28.2% from 2008. This represents a decrease in aggravated assault of 40.4% since 2006. Burglary decreased by 23.9% from 2008. This represents a decrease in burglary of 27% since 2009. Overall serious crime in Newark was reduced by 17.7% in 2009 from 2008. The total number of calls for service handled by NPD in 2009, increased by 9.5%.

Beginning in 2010, the Newark Police Department will change the way crime is classified. This change is necessary in order for Newark's crime categories to match the Federal Bureau of Investigations Uniform Crime Report. As a result of this change, certain crimes will show an increase in 2010 from 2009. For example: In Delaware, if a suspect threatens to hit a victim with a stick, the criminal charge would be "Aggravated Menacing." The FBI categorizes and reports the same action as: "Aggravated Assault." As a result, we expect Newark's 2010 crime statistics to show a large increase in reported "Aggravated Assault," while the actual number of people who are actually assaulted or struck will not increase. The change will also affect certain other crimes to a lesser extent.
