SUBJECT: Child's Identity Known

The identity of the child found at the Shell gas station on Sunday February 21 has been tentatively established. Due to the nature of the on-going investigation and multiple jurisdictions being involved, additional information is not able to be released at this time.

As soon as information can be made public, a release will be issued by this office. The time frame for the release of information can not presently be estimated.

SUBJECT: Abandoned Child Found at Gas Station

Around 2:45 p.m. today, the Newark Police Department was notified of a child found in the men's restroom at the Shell gas station, 804 south College Avenue, Newark. A patron intending to use the bathroom heard crying from inside. Eventually he entered and found the child inside alone.

At this point, the child's identity, and the identity of the person who left her in the bathroom, are unknown.

The child is a black female, appearing to be around 2 years old. Her hair is pulled up on top of her head. She is wearing a tan puffy winter coat over a size 3T purple shirt with small flower prints scattered on it. She has on size 3T blue jeans with a pink and white design stitched on the left leg. She is also wearing pink, white, and purple sneakers with purple laces, and white ankle socks. Her ears are pierced, but there are no earrings currently in the ear.
