SUBJECT: Arrest Made in Chapel Street and Wilbur Street Burglaries

Daniel T. Booker has been charged with the burglaries that took place in the early morning hours of August 5 on North Chapel Street and the early morning hours of August 6 on Wilbur Street.

Booker became a suspect when Newark Police officers saw him on Main Street on August 7 and noticed he strongly resembled the composite sketch of the burglar, which was created with the assistance of the Wilbur Street victim.

Booker was picked up at his home on August 9. He was charged with two counts of Burglary 2nd Degree. He was charged with one count of Unlawful Sexual Contact 3rd Degree, because his body came into contact with the buttocks of one victim. He was also charged with one count of Offensive Touching, because his body came into contact with the leg of the other victim.

After an initial appearance, Booker was released on \$8,500 unsecured bond, and was ordered to have no contact with the victims.

SUBJECT: Residential Burglary

The Newark Police Department is currently investigating a residential burglary that occurred on Wilbur Street at approximately 0430 hours on Friday morning. The victim, a 21 year old female UD student woke up to find a male intruder in bed with her. The intruder then got out of bed and left the residence. He could not be located by responding police units. The victim was not injured. The Newark Police investigators feel that this is related to a burglary that occurred last night on North Chapel Street. The suspect is described as a white male 20-35 years old, average height, thin build and thick curly unkempt hair.

The Newark Police Department is urging the public to ensure that their doors and windows are locked and to notify the police of any suspicious subjects.

SUBJECT: Residential Burglary

The Newark Police Department is currently investigating a residential burglary that occurred along North Chapel Street at 5:30 a.m. Thursday morning. The female victim woke to find the intruder apparently asleep with her in her bed. When the victim screamed the intruder quickly left the room. A search of the residence and surrounding area did not locate the intruder. The investigation revealed that the intruder gained access into the residence through an unsecured door. The intruder is described as a clean shaven white male; approximately 5'11" thin build with an unkempt hair.
