WEEKLY REPORT 09/12-09/18/10

Our K9 partners continue to be active. On Wednesday, September 15th, Corporal Jones and his K9 partner Paco stopped a vehicle for a traffic violation on South College Avenue. The driver was found to be in possession of marijuana and drug paraphernalia. On Thursday, September 16th, Cpl. La Rue and his K9 partner Sjors stopped a vehicle on Christina Parkway for travelling a speed of 106 mph. The driver was arrested for DUI. On Friday, September 17th, Corporal Jones and his K9 partner stopped a vehicle in the Burger King parking lot. The driver was arrested for DUI, possession of marijuana and drug paraphernalia.

Last week Detective Fred Nelson arrested one of the suspects in the robbery that occurred on Saturday, August 28th. In that robbery two university students were walking on North Chapel Street when two females approached them, sprayed them with pepper spray and stole their purses. Detective Nelson has identified the second suspect and the investigation is continuing.

On Saturday, September 18th, a Kells Avenue resident awoke at 4:30 a.m. to find a stranger in his bedroom. The resident and his roommate chased the suspect from the house and held him until the police arrived.

On Saturday, September 18th, at 11:04 p.m., Officers Hodge and Marsilii were dispatched to Margherita's Pizza on a report of a fight in progress. Upon arriving at the scene, witnesses reported that approximately seven males severely beat the victim, breaking his jaw. The investigation revealed that a suspect yelled out to a female in the victims company. The two had words and the suspects began to beat the victim before running down Main Street. When the initial call came into the police station, Lt. Hargrove activated the security cameras that were recently installed on Main Street. The cameras captured the suspects running down Main Street; with one suspect removing his red sweatshirt as he ran. The cameras tracked the suspects into a parking lot. Patrol officers were alerted and responded to the area where they located and arrested several of the suspects. The newly installed camera system will be fully operational the week of September 27th. Based on this one incident, the cameras should be a valuable asset to ensuring safety in the downtown area.

The Patrol, K9, and CID divisions, all continue to do an outstanding job with our fall crime suppression plan. The number of robberies has been reduced by 5 from this same time period last year. Numerous alcohol and disorderly premise arrests continue to be made.

The Traffic Division had been very active with traffic education and enforcement. The four members of the traffic division have been conducting pedestrian enforcement in the downtown area as well as speed and other traffic enforcement throughout the city. As a result of these efforts, the number of motor vehicle accidents has been reduced by 87 from the same time period last year. The division will be reduced to three officers while Cpl. Bolden attends a three week SWAT training program.

On Tuesday, September 21st, Det. Michael Van Campen received a Certificate of Appreciation for his work on Organized Crime Drug Task Forces from the Department of Homeland Security, Department of Justice and the Department of Treasury.
