SUBJECT: Two Arrested for June Strong Arm Robbery

The Newark Police Department has arrested 18 year old Louis Henderson and 17 year old Riffs Muraya, both of New Castle for the June 6th, 2011 strong arm robbery at 402 Stamford Drive.

Shortly after the initial incident police were called to the apartment complex after several subjects who fit the description from the robbery were observed in the apartment complex. Officers arrived and contacted Louis Henderson who, it was later learned, provided officers with a bad name. During a follow up investigation Newark Police Detectives arrested Henderson for Criminal Impersonation and later linked him to the robbery. Detectives continued their investigation and were also able to link Riffs Muraya to the crime.

With assistance from the US Marshals Service and the NPD Street Crimes Unit Louis Henderson was apprehended on November 25th, 2011 in the University Plaza Shopping Center. Riffs Muraya was located and arrested on November 29th, 2011.

SUBJECT: Police Investigate Strong Arm Robbery

The Newark Police Department is investigating a strong arm robbery which occurred on June 6th, 2011 at approximately 9:45pm outside of an apartment building located at 402 Stamford Drive. During this incident the 17 year old victim, who was sitting on his patio, was approached by two suspects who had just exited his apartment building. One of the two suspects demanded the victim's Iphone and attempted to forcefully remove the phone from the victim. The victim, however, fought back and refused to relinquish the phone. A struggle ensued between the first suspect and the victim and eventually the suspect was able to forcefully remove the phone. The two suspects then fled the area on foot toward Fairfield Park.

During the altercation the first suspect lost one of his sneakers. The victim's brother, who had been inside the apartment, heard the commotion and with the victim gave chase of the two suspects as they fled. The victims lost sight of the suspects as they entered into Fairfield Park. No weapons were displayed or implied during the incident and the victim was not injured.

Suspect 1 is described as a black male 17-19 years old, wearing a black shirt, dark colored jeans and one White, Black and Silver Nike size 11.

Suspect 2 is described as a black male wearing a long sleeve, dark green stripped polo.
