SUBJECT: NPD Investigating Strong-arm Robbery, Warrant Issued

Kyle Price was arrested by the Elkton, MD Police Department on September 21st and is currently incarcerated at Cecil County Detention Center where he is awaiting extradition to Delaware.

SUBJECT: NPD Investigating Strong-arm Robbery, Warrant Issued

NPD is investigating a strong-arm robbery that occurred at approximately 7:40pm on September 18th. At that time, a 21 year-old female University of Delaware student was walking westbound on the Pomeroy Trail near North College Avenue. Two white male suspects riding bicycles approached her from behind and demanded money from her. After the victim stated she didn't have any money, the suspects assaulted the victim and knocked her to the ground. The suspects went through her bag and after stealing a pink can of pepper spray, they fled westbound on Pomeroy Trail. The victim was not injured and declined medical attention.

Through the course of the investigation, Kyle Price was identified as a suspect and a warrant was issued for his arrest. Authorities in Delaware and Maryland are currently searching for him.

The Newark Police Department affirms that all defendants are presumed innocent until proven guilty beyond a reasonable doubt.
