Newark Police Seeking More Information on Possible Suspicious Incident

Newark Police are seeking more information on a suspicious incident alleged to have occurred on today's date at 10:25am in the 1000 block of Baylor Drive. A worker in the area observed a juvenile walking eastbound on Baylor Drive. A white female suspect driving a tan sedan eastbound on Baylor Drive drove up to the juvenile. The suspect asked the juvenile to help her look for her lost dog and to get in her vehicle. The worker reported that after the suspect saw him watching, the suspect sped off eastbound on Baylor Drive. The juvenile did not get in the vehicle. NPD has not located the juvenile or the driver.

The juvenile is a white male, approximately 6-7 years old.

The suspect is a white female, approximately 40 years old with blonde hair. The suspect vehicle is described as a tan or cream color Chevrolet sedan, possibly 2005-2007 model.
