Newark Police Arrest 4 Juveniles in Robbery

Newark Police arrested 4 juveniles in an armed robbery that occurred on September 18th at approximately 11:30pm. The victim was walking home from work on the west side of Marrows Road in the opposite direction of the suspects. After the suspects walked passed the victim, they got the victim to turn around and then hit him in the head with a handgun causing him to fall to the ground. The suspects kicked the victim and demanded his wallet. The victim relinquished his wallet and then jumped over the guardrail. The suspects then fled with the victim's wallet and bicycle. Minutes later, University of Delaware Police took the four suspects into custody at the Dart bus stop on Library Avenue. The defendants below were charged with the following charges:

Palmer, Stafford and Fennell received \$62,000 secured bail and were committed to New Castle County Detention Center. Nicholas received \$62,000 secured bail and was transported to People's Place in Townsend, DE.
