

WEEKLY REPORT

The Fall Crime Suppression Plan continues and officers remain busy with the increased volume of calls for service. During the period, officers responded to three separate alcohol overdoses requiring transport to Christiana Hospital for evaluation.

On September 20th, NPD Officers responded to a home in the 100 block of Kristin's Way for a report of a burglary in progress. When the officers arrived, they found the residents detaining a male subject who they found attempting to steal items from the home. The male had entered the house through an unlocked front door. The subject was charged with Burglary and related charges and committed to the Howard R. Young Correctional Facility.

On September 20th NPD Officers attended the Community Day festivities on the UD Green. The event was well attended and the officers received many positive comments from the community. While the traffic detour resulted in minor delays, there were no major incidents at the event.

In our continued partnership with the US Drug Enforcement Agency, Cpl. Craig Maurer began an assignment as a Task Force Officer with the agency on September 21st. Cpl. Maurer will be working with the Prescription Drug Diversion Group.

On September 23rd, NPD Officers assisted UDPD, providing support personnel for a demonstration on the UD Green. The event, attended by approximately 2,000 individuals was held to address racial concerns on the UD campus. The event was peaceful with no issues reported.

On September 24th, NPD held the second class of the Citizens Police Academy. Participants received instruction from Sgt. Andrew Rubin on DUI enforcement which included DUI detection and conducting standardized field sobriety tests.
