Newark Police Arrest One for Burglaries; Seek Another

February 24, 2016 – Newark Police have arrested Dustin Hults for his involvement in two burglary incidents, and are actively seeking Donald Schiavello for his involvement. The first burglary incident occurred on the unit block of North Street at approximately 5am on December 25th, 2015. The second incident occurred between December 26th and December 28th in the unit block of Prospect Street. Electronics, tools and other items were stolen during both incidents. Security camera footage captured during the North Street burglary helped link detectives to the suspects. NPD conducted a search warrant at the suspects' residence on January 6th, 2016 and seized stolen property from both burglaries and drug paraphernalia.

On February 16th, 2016, Dustin Hults turned himself into NPD. He received \$34,750 secured bail for the charges listed below and was transported to Howard R. Young Correctional Institution.
