A University of Delaware graduate student wrote to the police department to express her gratitude about Officer Matthew Coughlin. The student wrote: "On December 7th at about 12:40 am, I was out for a run in the Nottingham Green neighborhood. An officer pulled up to me and asked if I had seen a van driving around without any lights on. I told him I did not and he wished me a good run then left. At this time I was about 1 mile from my home and thanks to this officer I became increasingly vigilant of my surroundings, and as I was reaching home I saw his patrol car parked close by the route I run on. I felt safe and protected, and I am extremely appreciative of this officer for patrolling the neighborhood tonight. As a graduate student, I often work long hours and it is difficult to find time during the day to stay fit. Please allow me to extend my sincerest thanks to this officer and all the police officers within the department for keeping all of us safe every day!"

Recently, there have been a number of thefts of packages being removed from door steps. The police department reminds everyone that if a delivery is expected when no-one is home, to ask a neighbor to keep an eye out for the delivery.

In reviewing the "robbery" cases from this year, it was noted that several incidents were "shopliftings" that turned in a "robbery" classification when the suspect made physical contact with store staff. With the usual increase in shoplifting incidents during the holiday season, members of the police department are working with retail establishments in an effort to decrease incidents.

On an annual basis, occurring in January, members of the police department are transferred from platoons and special assignments. The upcoming administrative transfers include, Deputy Chief Mark Farrall will be transferred to Field Operations and Deputy Chief Kevin Feeney will be transferred to the Investigation and Administration Division. As part of Field Operations, Deputy Chief Farrall will become the chair of the Traffic Committee.
