Business and Non-profit Programs

Businesses and Non-profit organizations looking to improve facility energy efficiency should consider the Energize Delaware **Revolving Loan Program**. This low interest loan program provides competitively low interest rates and payment plans for energy saving repairs and installations. For more information, call 302-883-3048.

In addition, the Department of Natural Resources and Environmental Control (DNREC) provides grants to help commercial and industrial customers replace aging, inefficient equipment with energy efficient alternatives. The **Energy Efficiency Investment Fund** provides these grants and can be supplemented by funds from the Revolving Loan Program. For more details, call DNREC at 302-735-3366.

Finally, business customers can participate in the DEMEC **Demand Response Program** through its Active and Passive participation options. To receive financial incentives, Active participants are required to reduce their electric load when the regional coordinator, PJM, or DEMEC call upon them during the program period. Passive participants must make permanent energy efficient improvements that would lower electric usage during the program period. Customers may enroll new or previously completed projects that are no older than three years to receive program benefits. Lighting, HVAC, refrigeration, and electric water heating upgrades are all eligible for monetary incentives. For more information, call DEMEC at 302-653-2733.
