

WEEKLY REPORT

Criminal Division:

- On May 4, 2019, Newark Police Detectives arrested a 41 year-old male from Newark for Rape 1st, Unlawful Sexual Contact 3rd, Possession of a Deadly Weapon During the Commission of a Felony, Malicious Interference-Emergency Communications, and Theft Under \$1,500 after a victim reported being sexual assaulted at knifepoint by a male who posed as a ride-share driver, and who prevented her from calling 911 by retaining her phone. Detectives used evidence gathered from video surveillance, interviews, and a search warrant on the defendant's home and vehicles to make the arrest. The defendant was arraigned before the Justice of the Peace Court 20 and received \$63,000 cash bail. He was committed to the Howard R. Young Correctional Institution.

Patrol Division:

- On Friday, May 3, 2019, an employee of the Greene Turtle called to report a disorderly subject, wearing American Flag pants, who was acting disorderly and consuming alcohol underage in the bar. Upon arrival, staff members stated the male left the area walking southbound on South Main Street with three additional subjects. Using the description provided by staff members, officers quickly located the male wearing the American Flag pants in the area of the Sunoco. As officers attempted to contact this suspect, he fled from officers on foot. When additional officers responded to the area to initiate a search of the area, an officer located two males hiding in the rear yard of a residence on Apple Road. During questioning, these subjects were identified as friends of the male who fled from the Sunoco who continued to hide from officers. As a result of the on-scene investigation the suspects located were arrested for criminal trespass and underage consumption of alcohol. After marked units began to clear, the Street Crimes Unit continued to remain in the area and was ultimately able to locate the third suspect, who was wearing the American Flag pants. He was later arrested for trespassing, disorderly conduct, underage consumption of alcohol and resisting arrest.
- On May 6, 2019, Cpl. Coughlin was recognized at a ceremony hosted by the Lions Club as their 2018 Lions Club Officer of the Year.

Special Enforcement Division:

- On May 7, 2019, members of the Traffic Unit and Special Operations Unit (SOU) participated in Bike to School Week at Downes Elementary School. The unit will continue to address speed and other traffic complaints in the Oaklands and Fairfield

areas. On Tuesday, M/Cpl. Fountain attended a meeting with the Newark Bike Project. Throughout the week, the unit will focus on alcohol and order maintenance issues, including plain clothes enforcement activities.

Auxiliary Services:

- PSAP Manager Cannon participated in recent meetings/conference calls in advance of the kickoff of the Emergency Police Dispatch (EPD) software program for the 911 center. EPD training is tentatively planned for early fall 2019 and full implementation in October 2019.
- On May 6, 2019, Captain Van Campen attended the Lions Club ceremony for Cpl. Coughlin who was recognized as the recipient of the 2018 Lions Club Officer of the Year.

Administration Division:

- On May 4, 2019, the Admin Unit assisted with completion of police applicant written testing and physical agility testing.
- On May 8, 2019, Lt. Rubin and Sgt. Bryda attended a meeting with Representative Baumbach and his constituents to discuss crime related issues in Newark.
- During the week, the Admin Unit launched an interactive crime map (crimemapping.com) which will allow the public to search and review criminal activity within the community.
- Also, during the week, Lt. Rubin and Sgt. Jones met with members of the Patrol Division to discuss the current status of the recruits in field training and their anticipated transition to working on their own.
