

Weekly Report

Notable Notes:

- The Police Command Staff met at police headquarters on June 2nd and 3rd to discuss possible planned protest marches. Members of the department reached out to the organizer of a planned June 4th march, and was told the event was postponed to possibly another future date. The Newark Police Department has been in daily communication with surrounding police agencies to monitor events.
- Since stay at the home order has been in place in the state, the Newark Police Department has responded to three suicides and seventeen calls of person who attempted or were planning on committing suicide. This is a remarkable number of incidents in less than an eighty-day time period. The Newark Police Department encourages anyone who is feeling despondent to reach out to a friend, family member, social service agency or to NPD.

Patrol:

- On May 30, 2020, at approximately 9:48 p.m., Newark Police were dispatched to Christina Parkway (SR4), east of Elkton Road, for a report of a crash involving an overturned vehicle. An investigation at the scene determined that a 2017 Ford Mustang was traveling eastbound across the intersection of Elkton Road and Christina Parkway at a high rate of speed. The vehicle crossed over the center median on Christina Parkway and went through a guardrail on the north side of the roadway. The vehicle overturned and struck a pole, ejecting the driver and bringing down an electrical wire. The driver, who was the sole occupant, was conscious at the scene. He suffered serious injuries and was transported by EMS to an area hospital. The driver was later issued a summons for Careless Driving and Driving at an Unsafe Speed.
- On June 2, 2020 at approximately 1:35 p.m., Newark Police arrested a 32-year-old Newark Man for Burglary 3rd Degree and Theft Under \$1500 after he was observed entering a vehicle and removing items from within. The man also attempted entry into several other vehicles which were locked. He was committed to the Howard R. Young Correctional facility in lieu of \$30,000 secured bail.

Auxiliary Services Division:

- On June 1, 2020, the City of Newark received 200 masks from The Newark Partnership and the University Delaware. They collaborated on the project/donation with former Mayor Polly Sierer presenting the donation to members of the police department on Monday.
- The Newark Police Department Records Unit reopened the customer service window to the public on Monday June 1st. Members of the public are reminded to wear a mask when entering the municipal building.

Criminal Investigations Division:

- On May 31, 2020, at approximately 1:46 a.m., officers responded to Fresh Delaware at 800 Ogletown Road for a report of a burglary alarm. Responding officers found that glass had been shattered and the building had been entered. It was determined that merchandise was missing from the business. - On May 31, 2020, at approximately 12:01 a.m., officers responded to the 500 block of Capitol Trail for a report of a burglary in progress. Upon arrival several subjects were taken into custody and one subject was observed to have a gunshot wound to his leg. Detectives responded to the scene and determined the incident stemmed from a road rage incident and a group of the involved parties had forced their way into an apartment after following one of the drivers there. A resident of the apartment subsequently shot one of the suspects after he refused to leave the apartment and advanced on him. Three suspects were arrested, including the subject who was shot in the leg.
