



## CURBSIDE RECYCLING PROGRAM

The City of Newark offers curbside recycling once a week to residents. There is no need to separate recyclables; all items go into the same cart. Recycling helps prevent these materials from entering the waste stream and taking up landfill space. Please remember all recycling should be placed loose in your cart—**DO NOT BAG RECYCLING**.

The following are **ACCEPTABLE** items for recycling:

- Paper/Newspapers/Brown Paper Bags/Magazines/Catalogs
- Telephone Books/Soft Cover Books/Junk Mail/Envelopes (all types)
- Cardboard/Paperboard/(cereal-tissue boxes)
- Narrow-Neck Plastic Bottles
- Milk Jugs, Bleach/Detergent Bottles, Shampoo Bottles
- Glass Bottles/Jars (any color)
- Metal Cans (tin/steel/aluminum)



The following **ARE NOT ACCEPTABLE** for recycling:

- **GROCERY BAGS**—Please return all plastic grocery bags to the store you got them from for recycling.
- Motor oil and oil filters, Household Batteries, Styrofoam (accepted at Newark Recycle Center, 470 Corporate Boulevard, Monday-Saturday 8:30 a.m.—3:30 p.m.)
- Shredded Paper, Waxed Paper, Plastic Film
- Household Hazardous Materials (paint, fluorescent light bulbs, aerosol cans, bleach, home cleaning chemicals, explosives, nail polish remover and medications).
