SUBJECT: Nottingham Green Exposer Arrested

On Wednesday June 17 around 7:40 p.m., a Newark Police Officer was on patrol in the Suburban Plaza Shopping Center. He noticed a silver Volvo occupied by a white male who matched the description of the suspect in the Indecent Exposure incident that occurred in the Nottingham Green neighborhood.

The driver was contacted by the officer, who noted the driver was a white male with short brown hair, average frame, in his early 30's, with tattoos on his left arm. His physical appearance was an exact match to the description provided by the 10 and 11 year old girls in Nottingham Green.

During an interview with a detective, Goldstein acknowledged his involvement in the incident. He was charged with four counts of Indecent Exposure 1st Degree, and was committed to the Howard Young Correctional Facility in default of \$2000 secured bond. Goldstein was also ordered to have no contact with the victims, and if released, must be in his home between the hours of 8:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m.

SUBJECT: Man Exposes Himself to Young Females

An officer responding to a suspicious vehicle complaint on June 16 learned of an Indecent Exposure incident that occurred a week earlier. On June 9 around 3:15 p.m., four 10 and 11 year-old females were walking in the area of Bent Lane and Briar Lane in the Nottingham Green neighborhood, Newark. A car pulled to the curb ahead of the girls. The driver remained inside, staring at the girls as they walked. As the group passed the stopped car, they could see the driver had his pants lowered and was exposing his genitals. The girls continued walking; the car drove off.

The same car was seen in the neighborhood by one of the girls on June 16 around 5:00 p.m., which prompted the call to Newark Police. The investigation has revealed that the car has been seen driving slowly through the neighborhood on other days, including June 15, June 14, and on or around June 2.

The suspect is a white male, late 20's to early 30's, with short brown hair, and an average build. His left arm is heavily tattooed, particularly at the bicep. The car is a silver 4-door Volvo.

Parents are urged to warn their children about talking to strangers and approaching cars occupied by persons they do not know.
