Subject: Recommendation on the Award of Invitation to Bid (ITB) No. 24-05 – 2023/2024 Street

Improvement Program (CIP H2301)

#### **Background**

In October 2021, PWWR contracted with ARRB Systems to perform a citywide pavement condition assessment and inspection using advanced pavement condition testing equipment. This assessment method significantly reduced the time that staff spent evaluating street segments and provided objective road condition data such as crack density, rutting depths, roughness, pothole depths, and texture for each road segment.

The data collected was provided to our consultant, Kercher Group, Inc and was imported to AgileAssets Pavement Management Optimization software. PWWR selected the 2023/2024 streets based on the Kercher Group optimization report, as well as other factors that the analysis software does not account for. These factors include the timing and scope of other capital projects such as the annual water main replacement project, sanitary sewer point repair program, availability of outside funding sources like the Community Transportation Fund (CTF), and combining certain road segments to minimize mobilization costs to reduce neighborhood disturbance.

# **Purpose**

The ITB No. 24-05 Base Bid covers a combination of curb replacement, catch basin repair, ADA curb ramp installation, milling, hot mix patching, and hot mix resurfacing on twenty (20) City streets. Four (4) optional streets were also included in the contract as add items. Portions of the following streets are included in the contract as shown on the included exhibit:

#### **Bid Process**

The Purchasing Division advertised ITB 24-05 in <u>The News Journal</u>, posted the ITB on the City website (<u>www.newarkde.gov/bids</u>), and delivered it via email to several vendors. On Tuesday, April 23, 2024, two (2) sealed bids were received via email or hand delivery and were opened shortly after the 2:00 p.m. deadline. Pricing for each bid including both option streets are as follows:

Both bids exceeded available funding for the street segments included in the basic bid. Grassbusters Landscaping was the lowest qualified bidder, however unit pricing for most work items has increased significantly from prior years due to volatile demand for skilled labor and material costs. As a result of the bids being higher than anticipated, there are no option streets included in this recommendation and two (2) street segments have been carefully selected to be removed from the base bid. Improvements to Lincoln Drive and Madison Drive will be postponed due to the timing of other planned improvements in Dickey Park. Dickey Park improvements will require the mobilization of heavy equipment to facilitate the park upgrades and we run the risk of damaging these road segments should they be paved prior to the completion of the park project. Removing the above referenced street segments brings the base bid price down to \$1,879,329.00 and below our available funding.

Grassbusters Landscaping, Inc. has successfully completed the City's annual street improvement contract since 2018. The Public Works and Water Resources Department has been satisfied with all previous work and is confident the contractor has the resources and ability to complete the work in accordance with the plans, specifications, and schedule.

#### **Funding**

In addition to state-funded Municipal Street Aid, we have received Community Transportation Funding (CTF) commitments from Senator Sokola and Representative Baumbach totaling \$150,000. Senator Sokola and Representative Baumbach have asked that their funding be applied towards the improvement cost of Choate Street and Lynn Drive.

# Charter § 806.1(2) **DESCRIPTION & JUSTIFICATION**

In 2018 we contracted with a consultant to utilize an optimization software to analyze our road survey data and update previous reports using the same software. This program provided the City the optimal street repair locations and methods to use for the most economical use of our funding. The result of the analysis was confirmation of the need for an increase in funding for road rehabilitation or else the average Pavement Conditions Index (PCI) for the city will continue to decline and the backlog of needed improvements will continue to increase. As we have previously discussed, the optimization analysis shows that we would need to spend approximately \$1,500,000 - \$2,000,000 each year to maintain our current roadway conditions.

Individual streets are chosen for rehabilitation based on several factors including the report mentioned above, coordination with other operating departments and PWWR divisions, recent development, and funding from legislators.

#### 2023 Update:

Automated Pavement Conditions Assessment has been completed. 2023 candidate streets will be generated with the results of this assessment.
