WHAT DOES RDF STAND FOR?

RDF stands for Resident Discounted Fee. The Parks and Recreation Department strives to provide quality and affordable recreation opportunities to the community. In recognizing that City of Newark residents support our department along with other city services through their city taxes, residents are offered a discounted fee. Non-residents will pay the regular fee for programs. If you're unsure about resident status, you may call the Parks and Recreation Department at (302) 366-7000.

AMIA NEWARK RESIDENT?

Newark residents live within the corporate city limits. Not all persons with Newark mailing addresses live within the city limits. If you receive a City of Newark electric bill, you are a Newark resident. Not sure? The Parks and Recreation staff can assist you at (302) 366-7000. Those persons not living within the city limits are welcome to enjoy our activities at the fee listed.

DOES THE CITY OF NEWARK OFFER FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE?

The City of Newark is committed to providing recreational opportunities to everyone without regard to economic circumstances. For this reason, a fee assistance program for City residents is available for qualifying individuals (youth and adults). If you are interested in finding out more about the program, you are encouraged to contact Paula Ennis, Deputy Director, at the Parks and Recreation office for more information at (302) 366-7000. All inquiries and requests are strictly confidential. Funding for this program has been secured through the Federal Community Development Block Grant and is available on a limited basis.

WHAT IS THE JAMES F. HALL YOUTH SCHOLARSHIP FUND?

The City and family and friends of Jim Hall have established a scholarship to honor his memory and recognize his great contribution to the Newark community. Jim Hall was the City's first Parks and Recreation Director, an outdoorsman and a conservationist. He founded our Summer Playground and Rittenhouse Camp programs to share his love of nature with Newark's young people. The purpose of the scholarship is to provide tuition assistance to youth who would otherwise be unable to participate in our activities and programs. Andy passed away in January of 2012 and this scholarship was established in his memory and to his commitment to sportsmanship and to Newark Parks and Recreation youth programs. PROCESS & REFUNDS

REFUND POLICY

- 1. Registrants will receive a full refund if the program is cancelled by Newark Parks and Recreation.
- **2.** If you are unable to attend an activity, contact us at least 24 hours prior to the program start time. You may choose one of the following options:
 - **A.** Credit your account for the amount paid (credit is valid for one year from the date of issue);
 - **B.** Transfer you to another activity.
 - **C.** Receive a refund for the amount paid, less a processing fee of \$10 or 10% of the program cost, whichever is greater.
- **3.** If you are not satisfied with an activity, please contact us within 5 business days after the final class or meeting. We will offer to credit your account, transfer you to another program, or refund the amount paid less the applicable processing fee.
- 4. Credit card convenience fees are non-refundable.
- **5.** Credits and refunds do not apply to trips, events and adult sports leagues.
- 6. Additional policies related to trips can be found in the trip section of your e-newsletter
- 7. Please allow 3 4 weeks for refund processing.

WAITING LIST

If an activity is full, you may ask to be added to the waiting list or register for the waiting list online. If additional sessions become available, individuals on the waiting list will be contacted first.

OTHER IMPORTANT INFORMATION

- **1.** The City of Newark does not carry medical insurance for participants in City-sponsored activities or while using city parks or facilities.
- 2. Children may not accompany adults to programs specifically designated for adult participation.
- **3.** Any participant found to have falsified registration information will be removed from the activity without refund refund will be issued.

CLEAN UP PROGRAM

The City of Newark has 19 miles of trails and 37 parks totaling over 700 acres of parkland. Newark's Parks and Recreation Department is offering local civic, social, school and family groups an opportunity for direct stewardship of our park, stream and trail areas. The Adoption program asks that your group pick up litter at the agreed upon park area at least one time each month. Trash bags will be provided. The Parks and Recreation Department can provide a list of parks or stream areas to select from. Other care or improvement options are possible, such as horticultural plantings or stream bank erosion protection. BEFORE & AFTER CARE

DOWNES & WEST PARK ELEMENTARY

Our before and after-school programs provide children with enriching learning opportunities in a fun environment. They offer a wide range of activities, such as arts and crafts, indoor/outdoor play, games, homework help, and special projects. This program is exclusively for students from Downes and West Park Place Elementary Schools. Before-School Care starts at 7 a.m., and After-School Care concludes at 6 p.m.

Tuition fees for 2025-2026 will not increase. The \$25 enrollment fee secures your child's place in the program.

If you register a child for both Before and After Care, you will be credited for one of the enrollment fees for that child. September tuition invoices will be issued soon after registration. Subsequent tuition invoices for each month are issued on or around the first of the previous month, with a late fee applied after the 15th. Payments are due one month in advance of attending. Starting on Day 1 (Sep. 2) is not guaranteed for those registering after Aug. 15. For the school year, there are 10 payments, with June's payment being roughly half of the full monthly rate. Purchase of Care is accepted: Downes Site ID 1710314200; West Park Place Site ID 1710437400.

The program follows the Christina School District calendar and does not operate on days schools are scheduled to be closed. Completion of the State of Delaware Office of Childcare Licensing information forms is mandatory before your child attends.


