# 2024 Annual Report of Internal Affairs Investigations

#### **OVERVIEW**

During the 2024 calendar year, eighteen (18) internal affairs investigations were processed by the Professional Standards Office. The investigation into one incident is still pending. The investigations involved thirteen (13) different sworn employees and three (3) non-sworn employees. External sources accounted for five (5) investigations, while thirteen (13) were initiated from an internal source. External sources generally include complaints from a citizen about an employee's conduct or a concern with Departmental procedure.


\* Note – Each single incident/investigation may involve multiple officers and charges, but is counted as one incident.





### **Definitions:**

<u>Improper Conduct:</u> The allegation of misconduct is true, and the employee's action was inconsistent with Department policy.

<u>Proper Conduct:</u> The allegation is true, but the officer's action was consistent with Department policy.

<u>Policy Failure:</u> The allegation is true, but the officer's action was consistent with Department policy; however, the policy was unclear or inappropriate.

<u>Unsubstantiated:</u> There is insufficient evidence to determine conclusively whether the allegation was true or untrue.

<u>Unfounded Complaint:</u> The allegation is either demonstrably untrue or there is not credible evidence to support it.
